

Broomstick Lace Bonnet and Skirt Set Crochet Pattern



Materials:

- Yarn: Approximately 120 yards (60 yards of color 1 and 60 yards of color 2) of Worsted (4) weight yarn for smaller sizes, and approx. 220 yards (110 yards of color 1 and 110 yards of color 2) for larger sizes (I used Vanna's Choice)
- Crochet Hook: Size 5.5mm (I/9) – OR whatever size is needed to achieve gauge
- Yarn or Tapestry Needle

Abbreviations:

- CH: Chain
- SC: Single Crochet
- TW: Turn Work
- SC2tog: Single Crochet the next two sts together (single crochet decrease)

Gauge:

8 sts and 10 rows = 2 inches (5 centimeters)
in single crochet
It is important to check your gauge!

Average Head Circumference:

Newborn: 13-14"
0-3 Months: 14-15"
3-6 Months: 14-17"
6-12 Months: 16-19"
1-3 Years: 18-20"
3-10 Years: 19-20.5"

Newborn Hat Pattern

Chain 49 with color 1 yarn

Rows 1&2: SC into second chain from hook, SC into each stitch across, CH1, TW (48 total sts not including turning chain)

Row 3: SC into each stitch across, do not work a turning chain

Drop and cut color 1 yarn and pick up color 2 yarn

Row 4: Turn work, Place your hook into first stitch and pull up a loop of color 2 yarn approx. 1 inch (2.5 cm) tall. You can play with using a larger loop if you prefer. Each length of loop will have a slightly different finished look – just be sure to remain consistent across your project. Leave this loop on bar of hook. *Insert hook into next stitch, yarn over, and pull up a loop to the same height as first stitch* Repeat in each stitch across row. At end of row, pull your hook out of your loops and leave them (48 total loops) (See Photo 1 for instructions on pulling up loops, See Photo 2 for example of what project will look like after row 4)

Drop color 2 yarn and pick up color 1 yarn

Row 5: Turn work, *Place hook through first 4 loops and SC around them 4 times* Repeat for each section of 4 loops across the row, CH1, TW (48 total sts) (See Photos 3-5)

Rows 6&7: SC into each stitch across row, CH1, TW (do not turn work at end of row 7) (See Photo 6)

Repeat rows 4-7 until your piece measures approx. 4.75 inches (12cm) from the edge.

Be sure to end on a repeat of Row 7.

Edging:

Row 1: Repeat row 4

Row 2: Repeat row 5

Fasten off and weave in all ends.

Fold your piece in half with right sides facing each other (scalloped edge should be the front edge of the bonnet) and use your yarn or tapestry needle to seam up the back edge of the bonnet. Turn right side out.

OPTIONAL – If you would like a tidier look along the edges of your bonnet, you can add a SC edging all along the edge. I left mine without the edging because I like the wavy look.

Cut three strands of yarn approx. 38 inches long and pull them in a loop through a front corner of your project. Pull the ends of the yarn through this loop (this attaches the yarn without any knots, and makes your project look smoother). Separate the yarn into three sections and braid them to desired length. Secure and cut yarn evenly on the ends. Repeat on the other side of the bonnet as well.

Newborn Skirt Pattern Should measure approx. 13” (33cm) in circumference and approx. 5” (12.75cm) in length un-stretched

Chain 52 with color 1 yarn

Join in the round by slip stitching the first and last chains together, CH1

Rounds 1&2: SC into same stitch as CH1 (you will always start your rounds this way), SC into each stitch around, slip stitch into first st, CH1 (do not CH1 on round 2) (52 total sts)

Drop and cut color 1 yarn and pick up color 2 yarn

Round 3: Place your hook into first stitch and pull up a loop of color 2 yarn approx.

1 inch (2.5 cm) tall. You can play with using a larger loop if you prefer. Each length of loop will have a slightly different finished look – just be sure to remain consistent across your project. Leave this loop on bar of hook. *Insert hook into next stitch, yarn over, and pull up a loop to the same height as first stitch* Repeat in each stitch across row. At end of round, pull your hook out of your loops and leave them (52 total loops) (See Photo 1 for instructions on pulling up loops, See Photo 2 for example of what project will look like after round 3)

Drop color 2 yarn and pick up color 1 yarn

Round 4: *Place hook through first 4 loops and SC around them 4 times* Repeat for each section of 4 loops around the round, slip stitch into first st, CH1 (52 total sts) (See Photos 3-5)
Rounds 5&6: SC into each stitch around round, slip stitch into first stitch, CH1 (do not CH1 at end of round 6) (See Photo 6)

Repeat rounds 3-6 until your piece measures approx. 4.25 inches (10.75cm) from the edge.
Be sure to end on a repeat of Round 6.

Edging:

Round 1: Repeat round 3

Round 2: Repeat round 4

Fasten off and weave in all ends.

0-3 Month Hat Pattern

Chain 53 with color 1 yarn

Rows 1&2: SC into second chain from hook, SC into each stitch across, CH1, TW
(52 total sts not including turning chain)

Row 3: SC into each stitch across, do not work a turning chain

Drop and cut color 1 yarn and pick up color 2 yarn

Row 4: Turn work, Place your hook into first stitch and pull up a loop of color 2 yarn approx. 1 inch (2.5 cm) tall. You can play with using a larger loop if you prefer. Each length of loop will have a slightly different finished look – just be sure to remain consistent across your project. Leave this loop on bar of hook. *Insert hook into next stitch, yarn over, and pull up a loop to the same height as first stitch* Repeat in each stitch across row. At end of row, pull your hook out of your loops and leave them (52 total loops) (See Photo 1 for instructions on pulling up loops, See Photo 2 for example of what project will look like after row 4)

Drop color 2 yarn and pick up color 1 yarn

Row 5: Turn work, *Place hook through first 4 loops and SC around them 4 times* Repeat for each section of 4 loops across the row, CH1, TW (52 total sts) (See Photos 3-5)

Rows 6&7: SC into each stitch across row, CH1, TW (do not turn work at end of row 7)
(See Photo 6)

Repeat rows 4-7 until your piece measures approx. 5.25 inches (13.5cm) from the edge.

Be sure to end on a repeat of Row 7.

Edging:

Row 1: Repeat row 4

Row 2: Repeat row 5

Fasten off and weave in all ends.

Fold your piece in half with right sides facing each other (scalloped edge should be the front edge of the bonnet) and use your yarn or tapestry needle to seam up the back edge of the bonnet. Turn right side out.

OPTIONAL – If you would like a tidier look along the edges of your bonnet, you can add a SC edging all along the edge. I left mine without the edging because I like the wavy look.

Cut three strands of yarn approx. 38 inches long and pull them in a loop through a front corner of your project. Pull the ends of the yarn through this loop (this attaches the yarn without any knots, and makes your project look smoother). Separate the yarn into three sections and braid them to desired length. Secure and cut yarn evenly on the ends. Repeat on the other side of the bonnet as well.

0-3 Month Skirt Pattern – Should measure approx. 14” (33cm) in circumference and approx. 5.5” (14cm) in length un-stretched

Chain 56 with color 1 yarn

Join in the round by slip stitching the first and last chains together, CH1

Rounds 1&2: SC into same stitch as CH1 (you will always start your rounds this way), SC into each stitch around, slip stitch into first st, CH1 (do not CH1 on round 2) (56 total sts)

Drop and cut color 1 yarn and pick up color 2 yarn

Round 3: Place your hook into first stitch and pull up a loop of color 2 yarn approx. 1 inch (2.5 cm) tall. You can play with using a larger loop if you prefer. Each length of loop will have a slightly different finished look – just be sure to remain consistent across your project. Leave this loop on bar of hook. *Insert hook into next stitch, yarn over, and pull up a loop to the same height as first stitch* Repeat in each stitch across row. At end of round, pull your hook out of your loops and leave them (56 total loops) (See Photo 1 for instructions on pulling up loops, See Photo 2 for example of what project will look like after round 3)

Drop color 2 yarn and pick up color 1 yarn

Round 4: *Place hook through first 4 loops and SC around them 4 times* Repeat for each section of 4 loops around the round, slip stitch into first st, CH1 (56 total sts) (See Photos 3-5)
Rounds 5&6: SC into each stitch around round, slip stitch into first stitch, CH1 (do not CH1 at end of round 6) (See Photo 6)

Repeat rounds 3-6 until your piece measures approx. 4.75 inches (12cm) from the edge.

Be sure to end on a repeat of Round 6.

Edging:

Round 1: Repeat round 3

Round 2: Repeat round 4

Fasten off and weave in all ends.

3-6 Month Hat Pattern

Chain 57 with color 1 yarn

Rows 1&2: SC into second chain from hook, SC into each stitch across, CH1, TW
(56 total sts not including turning chain)

Row 3: SC into each stitch across, do not work a turning chain

Drop and cut color 1 yarn and pick up color 2 yarn

Row 4: Turn work, Place your hook into first stitch and pull up a loop of color 2 yarn approx. 1 inch (2.5 cm) tall. You can play with using a larger loop if you prefer. Each length of loop will have a slightly different finished look – just be sure to remain consistent across your project. Leave this loop on bar of hook. *Insert hook into next stitch, yarn over, and pull up a loop to the same height as first stitch* Repeat in each stitch across row. At end of row, pull your hook out of your loops and leave them (56 total loops) (See Photo 1 for instructions on pulling up loops, See Photo 2 for example of what project will look like after row 4)

Drop color 2 yarn and pick up color 1 yarn

Row 5: Turn work, *Place hook through first 4 loops and SC around them 4 times* Repeat for each section of 4 loops across the row, CH1, TW (56 total sts) (See Photos 3-5)

Rows 6&7: SC into each stitch across row, CH1, TW (do not turn work at end of row 7)
(See Photo 6)

Repeat rows 4-7 until your piece measures approx. 5.75 inches (14.5cm) from the edge.

Be sure to end on a repeat of Row 7.

Edging:

Row 1: Repeat row 4

Row 2: Repeat row 5

Fasten off and weave in all ends.

Fold your piece in half with right sides facing each other (scalloped edge should be the front edge of the bonnet) and use your yarn or tapestry needle to seam up the back edge of the bonnet. Turn right side out.

OPTIONAL – If you would like a tidier look along the edges of your bonnet, you can add a SC edging all along the edge. I left mine without the edging because I like the wavy look.

Cut three strands of yarn approx. 38 inches long and pull them in a loop through a front corner of your project. Pull the ends of the yarn through this loop (this attaches the yarn without any knots, and makes your project look smoother). Separate the yarn into three sections and braid them to desired length. Secure and cut yarn evenly on the ends. Repeat on the other side of the bonnet as well.

3-6 Month Skirt Pattern – Should measure approx. 16” (40.5cm) in circumference and approx. 6.5” (16.5cm) in length un-stretched

Chain 64 with color 1 yarn

Join in the round by slip stitching the first and last chains together, CH1

Rounds 1&2: SC into same stitch as CH1 (you will always start your rounds this way), SC into each stitch around, slip stitch into first st, CH1 (do not CH1 on round 2) (64 total sts)

Drop and cut color 1 yarn and pick up color 2 yarn

Round 3: Place your hook into first stitch and pull up a loop of color 2 yarn approx.

1 inch (2.5 cm) tall. You can play with using a larger loop if you prefer. Each length of loop

will have a slightly different finished look – just be sure to remain consistent across your

project. Leave this loop on bar of hook. *Insert hook into next stitch, yarn over, and pull up a

loop to the same height as first stitch* Repeat in each stitch across row. At end of round, pull

your hook out of your loops and leave them (64 total loops) (See Photo 1 for instructions on

pulling up loops, See Photo 2 for example of what project will look like after round 3)

Drop color 2 yarn and pick up color 1 yarn

Round 4: *Place hook through first 4 loops and SC around them 4 times* Repeat for each section of 4 loops around the round, slip stitch into first st, CH1 (64 total sts) (See Photos 3-5)

Rounds 5&6: SC into each stitch around round, slip stitch into first stitch, CH1 (do not CH1 at end of round 6) (See Photo 6)

Repeat rounds 3-6 until your piece measures approx. 5.75 inches (14.5cm) from the edge.

Be sure to end on a repeat of Round 6.

Edging:

Round 1: Repeat round 3

Round 2: Repeat round 4

Fasten off and weave in all ends.

6-12 Month Hat Pattern

Chain 61 with color 1 yarn

Rows 1&2: SC into second chain from hook, SC into each stitch across, CH1, TW (60 total sts not including turning chain)

Row 3: SC into each stitch across, do not work a turning chain

Drop and cut color 1 yarn and pick up color 2 yarn

Row 4: Turn work, Place your hook into first stitch and pull up a loop of color 2 yarn approx. 1 inch (2.5 cm) tall. You can play with using a larger loop if you prefer. Each length of loop will have a slightly different finished look – just be sure to remain consistent across your project. Leave this loop on bar of hook. *Insert hook into next stitch, yarn over, and pull up a loop to the same height as first stitch* Repeat in each stitch across row. At end of row, pull your hook out of your loops and leave them (60 total loops) (See Photo 1 for instructions on pulling up loops, See Photo 2 for example of what project will look like after row 4)

Drop color 2 yarn and pick up color 1 yarn

Row 5: Turn work, *Place hook through first 4 loops and SC around them 4 times* Repeat for each section of 4 loops across the row, CH1, TW (60 total sts) (See Photos 3-5)

Rows 6&7: SC into each stitch across row, CH1, TW (do not turn work at end of row 7) (See Photo 6)

Repeat rows 4-7 until your piece measures approx. 6.25 inches (15.75cm) from the edge.

Be sure to end on a repeat of Row 7.

Edging:

Row 1: Repeat row 4

Row 2: Repeat row 5

Fasten off and weave in all ends.

Fold your piece in half with right sides facing each other (scalloped edge should be the front edge of the bonnet) and use your yarn or tapestry needle to seam up the back edge of the bonnet. Turn right side out.

OPTIONAL – If you would like a tidier look along the edges of your bonnet, you can add a SC edging all along the edge. I left mine without the edging because I like the wavy look.

Cut three strands of yarn approx. 38 inches long and pull them in a loop through a front corner of your project. Pull the ends of the yarn through this loop (this attaches the yarn without any knots, and makes your project look smoother). Separate the yarn into three sections and braid them to desired length. Secure and cut yarn evenly on the ends. Repeat on the other side of the bonnet as well.

6-12 Month Skirt Pattern – Should measure approx. 17” (43cm) in circumference and approx. 7.75” (19.75cm) in length un-stretched

Chain 68 with color 1 yarn

Join in the round by slip stitching the first and last chains together, CH1

Rounds 1&2: SC into same stitch as CH1 (you will always start your rounds this way), SC into each stitch around, slip stitch into first st, CH1 (do not CH1 on round 2) (68 total sts)

Drop and cut color 1 yarn and pick up color 2 yarn

Round 3: Place your hook into first stitch and pull up a loop of color 2 yarn approx.

1 inch (2.5 cm) tall. You can play with using a larger loop if you prefer. Each length of loop will have a slightly different finished look – just be sure to remain consistent across your project. Leave this loop on bar of hook. *Insert hook into next stitch, yarn over, and pull up a loop to the same height as first stitch* Repeat in each stitch across row. At end of round, pull your hook out of your loops and leave them (68 total loops) (See Photo 1 for instructions on pulling up loops, See Photo 2 for example of what project will look like after round 3)

Drop color 2 yarn and pick up color 1 yarn

Round 4: *Place hook through first 4 loops and SC around them 4 times* Repeat for each section of 4 loops around the round, slip stitch into first st, CH1 (68 total sts) (See Photos 3-5)
Rounds 5&6: SC into each stitch around round, slip stitch into first stitch, CH1 (do not CH1 at end of round 6) (See Photo 6)

Repeat rounds 3-6 until your piece measures approx. 7 inches (17.75cm) from the edge.

Be sure to end on a repeat of Round 6.

Edging:

Round 1: Repeat round 3

Round 2: Repeat round 4

Fasten off and weave in all ends.

1-3 Year Pattern

Chain 65 with color 1 yarn

Rows 1&2: SC into second chain from hook, SC into each stitch across, CH1, TW
(64 total sts not including turning chain)

Row 3: SC into each stitch across, do not work a turning chain

Drop and cut color 1 yarn and pick up color 2 yarn

Row 4: Turn work, Place your hook into first stitch and pull up a loop of color 2 yarn approx. 1 inch (2.5 cm) tall. You can play with using a larger loop if you prefer. Each length of loop will have a slightly different finished look – just be sure to remain consistent across your project. Leave this loop on bar of hook. *Insert hook into next stitch, yarn over, and pull up a loop to the same height as first stitch* Repeat in each stitch across row. At end of row, pull your hook out of your loops and leave them (64 total loops) (See Photo 1 for instructions on pulling up loops, See Photo 2 for example of what project will look like after row 4)

Drop color 2 yarn and pick up color 1 yarn

Row 5: Turn work, *Place hook through first 4 loops and SC around them 4 times* Repeat for each section of 4 loops across the row, CH1, TW (64 total sts) (See Photos 3-5)

Rows 6&7: SC into each stitch across row, CH1, TW (do not turn work at end of row 7)
(See Photo 6)

Repeat rows 4-7 until your piece measures approx. 6.75 inches (17.25cm) from the edge.

Be sure to end on a repeat of Row 7.

Edging:

Row 1: Repeat row 4

Row 2: Repeat row 5

Fasten off and weave in all ends.

Fold your piece in half with right sides facing each other (scalloped edge should be the front edge of the bonnet) and use your yarn or tapestry needle to seam up the back edge of the bonnet. Turn right side out.

OPTIONAL – If you would like a tidier look along the edges of your bonnet, you can add a SC edging all along the edge. I left mine without the edging because I like the wavy look.

Cut three strands of yarn approx. 38 inches long and pull them in a loop through a front corner of your project. Pull the ends of the yarn through this loop (this attaches the yarn without any knots, and makes your project look smoother). Separate the yarn into three sections and braid them to desired length. Secure and cut yarn evenly on the ends. Repeat on the other side of the bonnet as well.

1-3 Year Pattern – Should measure approx. 18” (45.75cm) in circumference and approx. 8.75” (22.25cm) in length un-stretched

Chain 72 with color 1 yarn

Join in the round by slip stitching the first and last chains together, CH1

Rounds 1&2: SC into same stitch as CH1 (you will always start your rounds this way), SC into each stitch around, slip stitch into first st, CH1 (do not CH1 on round 2) (72 total sts)

Drop and cut color 1 yarn and pick up color 2 yarn

Round 3: Place your hook into first stitch and pull up a loop of color 2 yarn approx.

1 inch (2.5 cm) tall. You can play with using a larger loop if you prefer. Each length of loop will have a slightly different finished look – just be sure to remain consistent across your project. Leave this loop on bar of hook. *Insert hook into next stitch, yarn over, and pull up a

loop to the same height as first stitch* Repeat in each stitch across row. At end of round, pull your hook out of your loops and leave them (72 total loops) (See Photo 1 for instructions on pulling up loops, See Photo 2 for example of what project will look like after round 3)

Drop color 2 yarn and pick up color 1 yarn

Round 4: *Place hook through first 4 loops and SC around them 4 times* Repeat for each section of 4 loops around the round, slip stitch into first st, CH1 (72 total sts) (See Photos 3-5)
Rounds 5&6: SC into each stitch around round, slip stitch into first stitch, CH1 (do not CH1 at end of round 6) (See Photo 6)

Repeat rounds 3-6 until your piece measures approx. 8 inches (20.5cm) from the edge.
Be sure to end on a repeat of Round 6.

Edging:

Round 1: Repeat round 3

Round 2: Repeat round 4

Fasten off and weave in all ends.
