

## Vintage Turban Hat Knitting Pattern



### Materials:

- Yarn: Approximately 45 yards of super bulky (6) yarn for smaller sizes and approx. 65 yards for larger sizes.
- Knitting Needles: Size 10.0 mm (US 15) Double Pointed Needles (or use the magic loop method)
- Yarn or Tapestry Needle

### Abbreviations:

- K2tog: Knit two stitches together
- \*\*: Repeat the section in between the two stars as specified

### Gauge:

5 sts and 7 rows = 2 inches (5 centimeters)  
in stockinette stitch

\*\*\*It is important to check your gauge!\*\*\*

### Average Head Circumference:

Newborn: 13-14"  
0-3 Months: 14-15"  
3-6 Months: 14-17"  
6-12 Months: 16-19"  
1-3 Years: 18-20"  
3-10 Years: 19-20.5"

## **Preemie Pattern (Approx. 4-5 lbs.)**

Cast on 28 sts onto Double Pointed Needles (or use the Magic Loop Method) leaving an approx. 12 inch yarn tail

Join in the round and place stitch marker

Round 1: Knit

Continue to knit each round until your piece measures approx. 3.75 inches from the cast on edge.

Decreases:

Round 1: \*K2tog, K5\* Repeat around (24 total sts)

Round 2: \*K2tog, K1\* Repeat around (16 total sts)

Round 3: \*K2tog\* Repeat around (8 total sts)

Do not bind off. Cut approx. 7 inch tail. Using yarn needle, remove all sts from DPNs or magic loop, as if to purl. Pull tail through sts to cinch the top of hat. Using yarn needle, weave in the yarn end at the top of the hat into the knit side. Turn the hat inside out (Purled side out). See pictures below for example of how to cinch the hat along with following instructions.

Pick up your beginning yarn tail and count 5 sts over to the right and 8 rows up (See Picture 2). Use your yarn needle to take the yarn tail through the stitch that you counted to from the inside to the outside (See Picture 3). This will leave you with a fold inside the front of the hat (See Picture 4). Then take your yarn needle and pull your tail back to the inside of the hat being sure to hide this sewn stitch as much as possible on the outside (See Picture 5 for an example of what this step looks like inside the hat). Then take the yarn tail back to the point that it started at (your cast on position). Weave the tail into the hat at a diagonal angle heading back up to the point that you originally counted out (See Picture 6). Stop weaving when you get to that point, with your tail on the inside of the hat (See picture 7). Pull as tight as possible (See picture 8). This should create an angled cinch at the bottom front of your hat as pictured (See picture 9). Adorn with an embellishment of choice on the side of the cinch.

## Newborn Pattern

Cast on 32 sts onto Double Pointed Needles (or use the Magic Loop Method) leaving an approx. 12 inch yarn tail

Join in the round and place stitch marker

Round 1: Knit

Continue to knit each round until your piece measures approx. 4.5 inches from the cast on edge.

Decreases:

Round 1: \*K2tog, K2\* Repeat around (24 total sts)

Round 2: \*K2tog, K1\* Repeat around (16 total sts)

Round 3: \*K2tog\* Repeat around (8 total sts)

Do not bind off. Cut approx. 7 inch tail. Using yarn needle, remove all sts from DPNs or magic loop, as if to purl. Pull tail through sts to cinch the top of hat. Using yarn needle, weave in the yarn end at the top of the hat into the knit side. Turn the hat inside out (Purled side out). See pictures below for example of how to cinch the hat along with following instructions.

Pick up your beginning yarn tail and count 5 sts over to the right and 8 rows up (See Picture 2). Use your yarn needle to take the yarn tail through the stitch that you counted to from the inside to the outside (See Picture 3). ## 0-3 Month Pattern

Cast on 34 sts onto Double Pointed Needles (or use the Magic Loop Method) leaving an approx. 12 inch yarn tail

Join in the round and place stitch marker

Round 1: Knit

Continue to knit each round until your piece measures approx. 4.5 inches from the cast on edge.

Decreases:

Round 1: \*K2tog, K15\* Repeat around (32 total sts)

Round 2: \*K2tog, K2\* Repeat around (24 total sts)

Round 3: \*K2tog, K1\* Repeat around (16 total sts)

Round 4: \*K2tog\* Repeat around (8 total sts)

Do not bind off. Cut approx. 7 inch tail. Using yarn needle, remove all sts from DPNs or magic loop, as if to purl. Pull tail through sts to cinch the top of hat. Using yarn needle, weave in the yarn end at the top of the hat into the knit side. Turn the hat inside out (Purled side out). See pictures below for example of how to cinch the hat along with following instructions.

### 3-6 Month Pattern

Cast on 38 sts onto Double Pointed Needles (or use the Magic Loop Method) leaving an approx. 12 inch yarn tail

Join in the round and place stitch marker

Round 1: Knit

Continue to knit each round until your piece measures approx. 4.75 inches from the cast on edge.

Decreases:

Round 1: K2tog, K4, K2tog, K5, K2tog, K4, K2tog, K4, K2tog, K5, K2tog, K4 (32 total sts)

Round 2: \*K2tog, K2\* Repeat around (24 total sts)

Round 3: \*K2tog, K1\* Repeat around (16 total sts)

Round 4: \*K2tog\* Repeat around (8 total sts)

Do not bind off. Cut approx. 7 inch tail. Using yarn needle, remove all sts from DPNs or magic loop, as if to purl. Pull tail through sts to cinch the top of hat. Using yarn needle, weave in the yarn end at the top of the hat into the knit side. Turn the hat inside out (Purled side out). See pictures below for example of how to cinch the hat along with following instructions.

Pick up your beginning yarn tail and count 6 sts over to the right and 9 rows up (See Picture 2). ## 6-12 Month Pattern

Cast on 42 sts onto Double Pointed Needles (or use the Magic Loop Method) leaving an approx. 12 inch yarn tail

Join in the round and place stitch marker

Round 1: Knit

Continue to knit each round until your piece measures approx. 5 inches from the cast on edge.

Decreases:

Round 1: \*K2tog, K19\* Repeat around (40 total sts)

Round 2: \*K2tog, K3\* Repeat around (32 total sts)

Round 3: \*K2tog, K2\* Repeat around (24 total sts)

Round 4: \*K2tog, K1\* Repeat around (16 total sts)

Round 5: \*K2tog\* Repeat around (8 total sts)

Do not bind off. Cut approx. 7 inch tail. Using yarn needle, remove all sts from DPNs or magic loop, as if to purl. Pull tail through sts to cinch the top of hat. Using yarn needle, weave in the yarn end at the top of the hat into the knit side. Turn the hat inside out (Purled side out). See pictures below for example of how to cinch the hat along with following instructions.

## 1-3 Year Pattern

Cast on 45 sts onto Double Pointed Needles (or use the Magic Loop Method) leaving an approx. 12 inch yarn tail

Join in the round and place stitch marker

Round 1: Knit

Continue to knit each round until your piece measures approx. 5.5 inches from the cast on edge.

Decreases:

Round 1: \*K2tog, K7\* Repeat around (40 total sts)

Round 2: \*K2tog, K3\* Repeat around (32 total sts)

Round 3: \*K2tog, K2\* Repeat around (24 total sts)

Round 4: \*K2tog, K1\* Repeat around (16 total sts)

Round 5: \*K2tog\* Repeat around (8 total sts)

Do not bind off. Cut approx. 7 inch tail. Using yarn needle, remove all sts from DPNs or magic loop, as if to purl. Pull tail through sts to cinch the top of hat. Using yarn needle, weave in the yarn end at the top of the hat into the knit side. Turn the hat inside out (Purled side out). ### 3-10 Year Pattern

Cast on 48 sts onto Double Pointed Needles (or use the Magic Loop Method) leaving an approx. 12 inch yarn tail

Join in the round and place stitch marker

Round 1: Knit

Continue to knit each round until your piece measures approx. 6 inches from the cast on edge.

Decreases:

Round 1: \*K2tog, K4\* Repeat around (40 total sts)

Round 2: \*K2tog, K3\* Repeat around (32 total sts)

Round 3: \*K2tog, K2\* Repeat around (24 total sts)

Round 4: \*K2tog, K1\* Repeat around (16 total sts)

Round 5: \*K2tog\* Repeat around (8 total sts)

Do not bind off. Cut approx. 7 inch tail. Using yarn needle, remove all sts from DPNs or magic loop, as if to purl. Pull tail through sts to cinch the top of hat.
