

## Patriotic Mason Jar Cozy Crochet Pattern



### Materials:

- Yarn: Approx. 81 yards of worsted (4) weight yarn (29 yards white, 26 yards red, and 26 yards blue)  
(I used Red Heart Super Saver)
- Crochet Hook: Size 5.5 mm (I/9) OR whatever size is needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn or Tapestry Needle

### Abbreviations:

- DC: Double Crochet
- FPDC: Front Post Double Crochet
- FPHDC: Front Post Half Double Crochet
- SC: Single Crochet
- SC2tog: Single Crochet the next two sts together (decrease)
- CH: Chain
- \*\*: Repeat the section in between the two stars as specified

### Gauge:

7 sts and 8 rows = 2 inches (5 centimeters)  
in Single Crochet

\*\*\*It is important to check your gauge!\*\*\*

\*\*The first stitch of every round is always considered to be the same stitch you slipped into at the end of the previous round.\*\*

This pattern is designed to fit a wide mouth pint sized mason jar with a 10" (25.5cm) circumference.

## Patriotic Mason Jar Cozy Pattern

Chain 36 using white yarn

Join in the round by slip stitching first and last sts together.

**Round 1:** CH2, DC into each stitch around, slip stitch into first stitch (36 total sts)

**Round 2:** CH2, \*FPDC next stitch, BPDC next stitch\* Repeat around, slip stitch into first stitch

Drop white yarn (do not cut) and pick up red yarn

**Round 3:** CH2, FPDC into each stitch around, slip stitch into first stitch

Drop red yarn (do not cut) and pick up white yarn

**Round 4:** CH2, FPDC into each stitch around, slip stitch into first stitch

Drop white yarn (do not cut) and pick up red yarn

**Round 5:** CH2, FPDC into each stitch around, slip stitch into first stitch

Drop red yarn (do not cut) and pick up white yarn

**Round 6:** CH2, FPDC into each stitch around, slip stitch into first stitch

Drop white yarn (do not cut) and pick up blue yarn

**Round 7:** CH2, FPHDC into each stitch around, slip stitch into first stitch

Pick up white yarn. You'll be alternating between white and blue for the next round.

**Round 8:** CH2, \*FPHDC next stitch (white), FPHDC next stitch (blue)\* Repeat around, slip stitch into first stitch

Drop white yarn (do not cut) and use blue yarn only for next round.

**Round 9:** CH2, FPHDC into each stitch around, slip stitch into first stitch

Pick up white yarn. You'll be alternating between white and blue for the next round.

**Round 10:** CH2, \*FPHDC each of next 3 sts (blue), FPHDC next stitch (white)\* Repeat around, slip stitch into first stitch

Drop white yarn (do not cut) and use blue yarn only for next round.

**Round 11:** CH2, FPHDC into each stitch around, slip stitch into first stitch

Pick up white yarn. You'll be alternating between white and blue for the next round.

**Round 12:** CH2, \*FPHDC next stitch (white), FPHDC next stitch (blue)\* Repeat around, slip stitch into first stitch

Drop white yarn (do not cut) and use blue yarn only for next round.

**Round 13:** CH2, FPHDC into each stitch around, slip stitch into first stitch

Drop and cut blue yarn. Pick up white yarn.

**Round 14:** CH2, FPDC into each stitch around, slip stitch into first stitch

Drop white yarn (do not cut) and pick up red yarn

**Round 15:** CH2, FPDC into each stitch around, slip stitch into first stitch

Drop red yarn (do not cut) and pick up white yarn

**Round 16:** CH2, FPDC into each stitch around, slip stitch into first stitch

Drop white yarn (do not cut) and pick up red yarn

**Round 17:** CH2, FPDC into each stitch around, slip stitch into first stitch

Drop and cut red yarn. Pick up white yarn.

You'll now be working in continuous rounds. Place stitch marker.

**Round 18:** CH1, \*SC2tog, SC each of the next 4 sts\* Repeat around (30 total sts)

**Round 19:** CH1, \*SC2tog, SC each of the next 3 sts\* Repeat around (24 total sts)

**Round 20:** CH1, \*SC2tog, SC each of the next 2 sts\* Repeat around (18 total sts)

**Round 21:** CH1, \*SC2tog, SC next stitch\* Repeat around (12 total sts)

**Round 22:** CH1, \*SC2tog\* Repeat around (6 total sts)

Continue to SC2tog until the hole at the bottom of your cozy is closed. Cut yarn with an approx. 7 inch yarn tail. Use your yarn or tapestry needle to secure the top hole, and secure and weave in all ends.

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
